- June 21 Farmers' Market Event. In addition to a Spokes stall we are running a 'Thanks for Shopping by Bike' Event. Details here...

 We need one or two additional volunteers to help. Sessions 9-11 or 11-1, or all 4 hours. If you can help, email mknottenbelt1ATgmail.com.
- Ongoing volunteer. Our Resources Group could do with one or two new regular members. We run a lot of 'behind the scenes' activity without which Spokes could not function as well as it does organising stalls, our annual competition, public meetings, preparing envelopes etc for the mailout, and one-off projects when there is someone in the group who has a relevant special interest (e.g. tenement bike parking). *Your commitment is* to attend an evening meeting roughly every 3 weeks, as regularly as possible, and sometimes do one or two tasks between meetings (often in conjunction with others) e.g. helping at stalls, getting competition prizes, etc, various things needed for ongoing activities. - Now till June 18 Bike Breakfast feeder-ride organiser. For the last 2 years we have had 'feeder rides' to the Bike Breakfast from a few parts of the city, usually with some of the local councillors or MSPs joining in.  Unfortunately, Mike Smith, who coordinated this, has left Edinburgh. After several requests, no one has volunteered to take over, so it looks as if there will be no centrally organised/advertised feeder rides this year. A volunteer would liaise with local ride leaders, encourage and/or help them

to contact councillors etc, update the website as details became available, and so on. Familiarity with social media is important, ideally including a Bike Breakfast Q/A thread on www.citycyclingedinburgh.info. Mike is available to advise by email. • **Bike counting – various sessions now till mid June**. As you may know, the council's George Street experimental segregated cycleroute is to be installed this summer. [Incidentally, our submission to the council is on this page... www.spokes.org.uk/wordpress/documents/members-campaigning/edinburgh/princes-st-city-centre/

At our suggestion the council intends to monitor cycle use not just along the street, but also on Princes Street and at junctions along George Street. They need to do counts before and after the route is installed. Because of the number of counts/locations they are looking for volunteers [i.e. unpaid] to help with counts. Volunteers are mainly needed for sessions between 12-2, May 26-June 7, but there may also be other times/days.

• Leafleting conference attendees, various June dates, usually first thing a.m. The summer spokes bulletin (no.119) will be out on Sat 31 May.

- Edinburgh Heritage cycling routes. The Council's Culture & Sport Dept is interested in developing some (fairly traffic-free) cycle tours which visit locations important to Edinburgh's *cultural* and/or *sporting* heritage. If anyone can suggest such routes please email spokesATspokes.org.uk.
- **Spokes in-email** The person who handles email to the spokes address and messages left on our website is wanting a change, so we need another person to take over. This is an important and responsible task. Obviously a handover and advice can be provided at first. If at all possible we need somebody who has been a member for some time and who expects to be able to do the job for some time. Ideally also willing to attend either Planning or Resources group (meetings of both are every 3/4/5 weeks) so as to be in good touch with spokes activities. The task involves passing on emails to the relevant person/group as appropriate, and also responding directly to some enquiries, ensuring that people contacting us are not left without a reply for longer than necessary.

C. PLANNING APPLICATIONS AND PAN EXHIBITIONS/CONSULTATIONS

NB – as explained on that page, a PAN is when the developer of a large proposal is required to hold a public consultation and exhibition, the results of which must be taken into account in their subsequent planning application.

- Craighouse housing development 12/04007/Sch3 [Previous application was 12/04007/FUL]. After their first 2 applications were turned down, the developers are submitting yet another application. At this time the details are not yet on the council website, but should be soon. There will also be a physical model of the plans available 'from early June.' This, and the revised plans, will be viewable at *Planning and Building Standards Enquiry counter, Waverley Court, 4 East Market Street, Edinburgh EH8 8BG*. This is open 8.30 5.00 Monday to Thursday and 8.30 3.40 Friday.
- New Sick Kids Hospital [at new Royal Infirmary] 14/01796/AMC plus landscape/parking plan 14/01797/FUL. Closing date for comments 6 June.
- Cammo Walk/ Maybury Rd 670-space residential development 14/01776/PPP Greenfield site. However one could ask that if permission is granted then Cammo Walk to be closed to motor traffic (at least the section south of the right-angle bend).
- Craigmillar Town Centre 14/01696/PAN Mixed-use development in the large cleared area north of Niddrie Mains Road. The site cuts across the existing Peffer Place, a quiet road closed to through motor traffic. This is a PAN, not yet a planning application. Therefore there will be a public exhibition for comments.... 11 June, 3-7pm, at The White House, Niddrie Mains Road.
- [West Lothian Linlithgow] Cemex Site Kettlestoun Mains, major residential development 0249/PAC/14 This is a PAN, so will be an exhibition ... Thursday 05 June, 2014 at the Linlithgow Burgh Hall, 1pm-8pm. We could possibly suggest a segregated cycleroute to and beside the site alongside the adjacent A706 and the link road north to Linlithgow Bridge. Developer contact is alan.farningham@farnmac.co.uk.
