




Sustrans Community Links Programme

The Community Links Programme is a grant scheme run by Sustrans, with funding from Transport Scotland, for the creation of walking and cycling infrastructure for everyday journeys. It is a key element in Sustrans Scotland's commitment to meeting the vision of the Scotlish Government's Cycling Action Plan for Scotland (CAPS) of 10% of trips by bike by 2020.

For 2014/15 Sustrans has allocated over £14 million to help deliver 136 cycling projects across Scotland, including over £3.5 million to projects in Edinburgh and the Lothians. A further £10 million has been allocated for 2015/16, much of it for larger projects continuing from 2014/15.

Statutory bodies, such as local authorities, were invited to submit applications for proposed projects, with a condition that they must at least match fund what they receive from Sustrans. In reality, they are actually set to contribute over £18 million and, therefore, over £32 million will be invested into cycling and walking facilities.

New facilities will include many short links to schools, shops and other useful destinations, as well as bold initiatives which overcome significant barriers. This year, for the first time, the schemes to be funded include a selection of large scale exemplar projects. In Edinburgh and the Lothians there are three such projects: Leith Walk, the Canal-Meadows-Innocent route, and at Almondvale in Livingston. See overleaf for details.

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EXEMPLAR COMMUNITY LINKS PROJECTS IN EDINBURGH AND THE LOTHIANS

The City of Edinburgh Council successfully led eight bids to Sustrans for Community Links Funding and for the first time a University, Edinburgh Napier University, made a successful bid. Sustrans is set to contribute over £2.8 million of 'Community Links' funding towards cycling and walking improvements in Edinburgh in 2014 / 15.

Funding includes the previously-announced money to greatly enhance walking and cycling conditions in Edinburgh Council's redevelopment of Leith Walk. It allows replacement of London Road roundabout by traffic signals, segregated cycle routes up from Pilrig, carefully-designed onroad cycle lanes between Pilrig and the Foot of the Walk, and convenient cycle parking. Overall, the project will mean development of a high quality streetscape along this lively and complex street

which contains more than 1,000 dwellings. Sustrans is delighted to be involved in this huge enhancement of options for walking and cycling.

Edinburgh will also see the development of a route for pedestrians and cyclists linking the Union Canal, the Meadows and National Cycle Network Route 1 at the Innocent Tunnel. Sustrans will contribute £500,000 of 'Community Links' funding, which will be matched by £500,000 from the Council. The project will transform the quality of the National Cycle Network in the area and link East and West Edinburgh to the Tollcross and Southside shops and to the central University area.

The project by Edinburgh Napier University will benefit staff, students and visitors to both Edinburgh College and Edinburgh Napier, in


addition to students attending Forrester High and St. Augustine High and members of the general public who cut through both campuses between Calder Road and Bankhead Avenue. It will see a shared cyclist and pedestrian path joining Bankhead Avenue to the Napier Sighthill campus via the Edinburgh College Sighthill campus. This will provide a pleasant route for cyclists and pedestrians to reach public transport services north of both campuses, such as the new Bankhead tram stop and Edinburgh Park Train Station, instead of through a busy car park as at present.

West Lothian Council has been awarded funding for 10 projects. With match funding, this will mean over £3.5 million of new cycling and walking initiatives over the next two years.

West Lothian's 'exemplar' scheme will bring

major improvements for cyclists and pedestrians in and around Almondvale Park in Livingston, with £1.6m invested in the area. National Cycle Network route 75 will be transformed, moving into the park from the main road, and linked by new and upgraded subsidiary routes to the shopping centre, local housing and other useful destinations. The greenspace around the park will also be improved to make the whole area more pleasant for cycling and walking.

Other West Lothian projects include links from local towns to the new rail stations at Armadale and Blackridge, and to the canal towpath from Linlithgow Academy, Linlithgow Leisure Centre, and from Broxburn town centre. An innovative scheme to make the Bathgate Hills rural roads more walking and cycling friendly is also planned.
