SPOKES BULLETIN

Spokes 106 has 12 pages instead of the usual 8, thanks to a 4-page supplement funded and prepared by the Bike Station. We are considering other expanded editions in future. The *extra cost* of a 12-page issue, both printing and postage, is around £700. If you have ideas for organisations who might be interested in a supplement, please get in touch. Supplements must be from organisations sharing our aims, and the content must be relevant. For commercial bike-related organisations we might consider one or two full-page adverts in order to fund a 12-page issue.

There are a minimum 11,500 copies of each issue. Of these around 1000 go to named decision-makers in Edinburgh, the Lothians, and across Scotland. Including, all MSPs, all Edinburgh and Lothians councillors, all Scottish transport departments, all directors of Public Health, transport consultancies, etc, etc. Some 3500 go to Spokes members, many of whom take extra copies to leaflet bikes at work, shops, etc. Most others are distributed through bike shops, libraries, community centres, etc, widely throughout Edinburgh and the Lothians, and some further afield.

Last autumn Edinburgh Council consulted on early proposals for their **Open Space Strategy**. *If you wrote in at that time, thank you!* The Council has now published for consultation a final draft of the Strategy - and it includes some exciting ideas, very possibly influenced by your comments. *We hope interested members will again respond to this consultation on the final draft* – and you can now include some congratulations as well as your ideas for further improvement – *it's always a good idea to support what is particularly good as well as suggesting improvements*.

The consultation runs March 26 to May 21 – consultation events will be listed on the above page shortly. *Comments should be sent to:* openspacestrategy@edinburgh.gov.uk.

The Strategy is setting the scene for what the council intends to achieve over 10-15 years, with many of the costly proposals having to wait to be funded by outside sources such as adjacent developments, or by funding applications – the council's own funding is likely to be quite limited in the next few years. The Strategy will be accompanied by 12 **Area Action Plans**, giving more detail and hopefully some idea of expected timescales.

One excellent point is that the draft Strategy has the idea not just of individual parks, etc, but of a *Green Network* "connecting green spaces as part of a network for people to walk or cycle through.." Even better, the Strategy has a long list of proposed actions to improve network connections, including...

- ◆ New pedestrian/cycle route connecting Roseburn to Union Canal, using disused railway embankments and new bridges [including a new pedestrian/cycle canal connection at Yeaman Pl.] This connection between the North Edinburgh Network and South Edinburgh is a long-held Spokes ambition, but one we doubted would appear in council proposals due the likely costs. It was also a prizewinner in our 2009 competition on how to spend £1m to get more people cycling − see spokes website downloads − odds and ends competition.
- ◆ Green corridors along Powderhall and/or Abbeyhill Loop rail lines if they close in future this is an existing commitment.
- ◆ Off-road pedestrian/cycle green corridor from Union Canal to Morningside, running beside the South Suburban Railway from Colinton Road to Maxwell Street existing old proposal.

When responding please suggest further links you'd like to see connecting up the green network. And copy your ideas to us too, so we can consider them for the Spokes submission.

Here are some possible suggestions...

- ◆ Pedestrian/cycle bridge over Leith Walk Greener Leith's proposal for Stead's Place/ Jane St area, on the line of the old railway over Leith Walk, linking North Edinburgh Network to Leith Links, to East Edinburgh Network, and on to Portobello. See www.greenerleith.org [search for Leith Walk bridge].
- ◆ Pedestrian/cycle bridge over suburban railway Grange/ Prestonfield Community Council idea in Relugas Road area, avoiding main roads to link Meadows area to Kings Buildings area. A long-term, expensive project, but no more costly or ambitious than the Plan's proposal for Roseburn to Canal.
- ◆ South East Wedge Parkland paths are proposed for this area, but not in detail they need to link Midlothian to the Infirmary and the City by high quality convenient routes.
- ◆ International Business Gateway, West Edinburgh a new green network is shown within the IBG development area but a connection is vital from there to Gogar Rail/Tram Interchange, then under the bypass and so to the Gyle Centre and the city. This is the underpass which Transport Scotland is currently proposing to be "get off and push" see Spokes 106 p7. The route is shown in the draft Strategy as 'Other Access Potential' that is not good enough, it needs to be a definite proposal.
- ◆ 'Other Access Potential' the map on p10-11 shows various connections marked with brown dots with this meaning. Check

them carefully, and if any are important enough to be made definite proposals, say that in your response.

◆ A90 Path to Forth Bridge – a direct path exists, but its quality as the main commuting and tourist holiday route from Edinburgh to the Forth Bridge, Queensferry and the North is disgraceful. Spokes has long campaigned on this. The conversion of the path into a high quality route, as European visitors would expect (let alone local commuters) is vital. Had the new Scottish Government not removed capital funding from our local Regional Transport Partnership, SEStran, this route would probably now be built.

PATHS NEWS

A Spokes member who regularly walks the towpath did a count after a few scary experiences: she found only 4 of 100 cyclists coming up behind used a bell. Overtaking without warning can be frightening: please remember **www.politecycling.info/edinburgh** "On shared paths: slow down, ring a bell, say thanks when passing."

Sustrans is to upgrade **Christian Path** in Portobello. Site clearance is soon and upgrade work hopefully in 2010/11. Please send ideas, comments, queries to philip.kearney@sustrans.org.uk.
