A3. FORTRESS WAVERLEY - email your MSPs if you've not yet done so

Many Spokes members from outside the city use Waverley with a bike, and many are concerned about Network Rail's cycling ban on the Waverley Bridge entry ramps - forcing bikes, pushchairs, luggage and large numbers of commuters and tourists onto the narrow footways whilst the wide adjacent roadway is just for the very occasional delivery van.. http://www.spokes.org.uk/wordpress/2014/07/fortress-waverley/

Since we last circulated about this, our member **Mark Lazarowicz MP** (and others) have heard from Network Rail that they may reconsider their delivery arrangements (the rumour is that they might use Calton Road instead) but no time-scale has been given. We have given a link to the Mark Lazarowicz letter in the above website article.

If you are affected, please do contact your MPs and MSPs – the more emails the better! Say you are pleased to hear that Network Rail are reconsidering their delivery arrangements, and ask them to ask Network Rail for a time-scale and for an assurance that a Waverley Bridge ramp will then be given over to pedestrian/cycle-friendly conditions.

B3. NORTH BERWICK CYCLE GROUP - 'CYCLEFORTH'

A cycle campaign group has been created for North Berwick area., with objectives very similar to those of Spokes – to get better conditions for using a bike and to get more people cycling, especially for everyday journeys.

Amongst other ideas, Cycleforth is surveying the new John Muir Way cycle route, which has been rather slapped into place without adequate consideration of the cyclists who might use it – the group will be pressing for safety measures and tweaking of the route. Another aim is signed family-friendly cycle routes from the railway station to the two castles – little groundwork is required, just a commitment to get it done.

C2. BORDERS RAIL – BIKE CAPACITY – *lobby for better!*

This is really poor provision compared to most other lines coming into Edinburgh – for example the North Berwick and the Glasgow trains – affecting both commuters and leisure users. If you'd like something better, email...

- Abellio the Dutch rail company who will take over ScotRail in April [abellio.com/scotrail]. They have a great reputation for bike/rail integration, so ask them if they can improve on the current plans, and tell them why it matters to you. Email.. scotrail AT abellio.com.

C3. BORDERS RAIL – ROUTES TO STATIONS

The Campaign for Borders Rail, which fought for the new railway and is now fighting to maximise its potential would find it very useful to have an audit of the 7 stations (now under construction) to find "*how well the seven stations connect to safe cycle and walking routes around them and identification of any obvious gaps where new links, crossings etc should be provided.*"

CBR has already had one success in getting agreement for a new direct path from Newtongrange Station to the National Mining Museum and more lobbying could be done if further opportunities are found.

However CBR have a great deal on their plate and cannot organise this audit themselves. If anyone is willing to take it on – or participate as a volunteer – please contact David Spaven, email david AT deltix.co.uk.

It someone can take on organising this we could email round local members again asking for volunteers to join in.

D. MAINLY WEST LOTHIAN

D1. GLASGOW-FALKIRK-EDINBURGH RAIL ELECTRIFICATION [EGIP project]

Work is now underway on this huge project. There will be a Network Rail Community Drop-In, 3.30-7.30pm on Thurs 6th & 13th November, at the Low Port Centre, Blackness Road, Linlithgow.

One vital issue will be the bike capacity of the new electric trains. The EGIP staff at the drop-in probably won't have answers, but it is important to keep the issue high in their minds. Emails can also usefully be sent to Abellio, who will be running all ScotRail trains from April 2015 [see C2 above].
