ACTION WANTED NOW

On May 2nd 1978 the Labour Party gained full control of Lothian Region in the regional elections, and are therefore responsible for Highways and many other matters of concern to cyclists. Before the elections SPOKES obtained statements on cycling provision from the major parties. These are available in full from SPOKES, but since Labour is in control we remind readers of their policies:

"The following are excerpts from our transport policy statement:

- All traffic management schemes* will be designed so as to avoid lengthening trips for cyclists. Road closures (e.g. in conjunction with bus lanes) will allow for the unimpeded passage of cyclists.

 Cycle racks (suitable for locking) will be provided in the city centre and at all other convenient locations.

- A study of other possible measures for pedestrians and cyclists will be undertaken immediately including the possibility of networks of cycleways and walkways.

-The implications for walkers' and cyclists' routes will be considered in relation to all new develop-

*Traffic Management Schemes are things like oneway schemes, bus lanes, traffic islands, etc., designed to change traffic movements without new road building.

Cyclists (and pedestrians) are urged to make sure that these policies are carried out soon. Write now, asking for immediate action, to Clir. Mrs. Catherine Filsell.

NO BIKES HERE BY ORDER

major rearrangement of traffic and pedestrians is planned in THE CONVERSION OF **HIGHWAYS** (BRISTO STREET: MARSHALL STREET, CHARLES STREET, TEVIOT ROW, LOTHIAN STREET AND POTTERROW, EDINBURGH) ORDER. REFERENCE No. P/RDS/4/1/LA/1.

SPOKES is appalled that in this area of heavy and continuous cycle use, no considera-

tion has been paid to cyclists.

Some of the streets mentioned are to be pedestrianised, and the order specifies that they can still be used even by such unlikely traffic as telephone wire laying vehicles - but no mention of bikes. When will The Highways Department accept that it is possible [and most desirable to travel without an accelerator, an exhaust pipe and a full wallet to

empty at petrol stations?

SPOKES urges all cyclists to write and point out that cyclists must be considered. Cyclists should be allowed to use the pedestrian areas (which will be very wide), and a cycle underpass should be provided with the proposed pedestrian underpass under the new road. Objections must be sent to The Secretary of State, Scottish Development Department, New St. Andrews House, St. James Centre, arrive by Friday June 9th. P/RDS/4/1/LA/1 on the top of your letter. If feeling enthusiastic, write to The Director of Highways too, 19 Market Street, to ask why bikes were not included.

THOUGHTS OF THE HIGHWAYS DEPARTMENT

A letter to SPOKES in late 1977 from the Director of Highways (Mr A. Crockett, 19 Market Street) stated "Pressure of work in the formulation of major transport policy has precluded any action [on cycling] so far."

This is a most ingenious argument. In fact if the Education Department took a tip from Mr Crockett they could say "Our main job is to cater for school pupils so we'll have to forget about Adult Education for a few years" and Social Work could say "Most of our clients are pensioners, so we'll not take any action on battered children meantime."

POTHOLES

In our experience The Highways Department is very quick to patch potholes WHICH ARE REPORTED TO THEM. You can also get compensation if your bike is damaged by a particularly bad pothole. A SPOKES member writes.....

My advice to you to fill your favourite pothole is to write to the Director of Administration, Lothian Regional Council, 12 St. Giles Street, Edinburgh, naming precisely the location of your chosen pothole(s). If your bike was damaged, describe the damage to it (and perhaps to you) and state your intention to send them later a receipt for any necessary repairs. IT IS ESSENTIAL TO DESCRIBETHE EXACT LOCATION OF THE POTHOLE. Let friends know of your success. Make potholes rule no more O.K.! After an accident myself, I took action. The result was one new wheel and a promptly repaired hole courtesy of the Lothian Regional Council.

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MEADOWS AREA SURVEY

Cycle Use at 7 road junctions round The Meadows was measured by 20 SPOKES supporters from 7.30-10.00 a.m. on May 10 (a warm sunny day) and May 12 (cold and dull). As far as we know this is the first major survey of cycle use to be done in Edinburgh. This is really the job of the Highways Department and in future we hope they will do it. Motorists don't have to sit at junctions counting cars!

The number of cycle movements observed was 1307 on May 10th, and this dropped by only 15% on the cold day. Some cycles were counted at 2 or more junctions, and our statistical expert calculates that between 766 and 1090 different cycles were seen. These are very much minimum figures since many cyclists avoid the major road junctions by taking side routes and/or pushing their bikes.

Meadows Cycle paths

Our results, together with the 500% increase in accidents to cyclists on roads near the Meadows between 1974/75 and 1976/77, show the need for Meadows cycle paths. These would allow several hundred bike users to avoid some of the hazards at junctions and on roads round the Meadows. If properly designed they would not significantly endanger or inconvenience pedestrians. They would encourage more car users to change to bikes, so increasing everybody's safety.
