IMPORTANT NEWS

Since *Spokes Bulletin* #127 went to press...

SCOTTISH BUDGET PASSED

The **Scottish draft budget** has been passed – with no change on cycling investment. The **rise** in trunk road spending (£146m) is **nearly 4 times** the **total** for walking and cycling for the whole of Scotland (£39m). For every adult and child in Scotland the government plans to spend £150 on trunk roads this year, and just £7 on walking and cycling.

EDINBURGH ON CL+ FINAL SHORTLIST

Edinburgh Council has won 2 of the 5 places in the Sustrans [Community Links Plus](http://www.sustrans.org.uk) shortlist [Bulletin 127, p7] – for *Meadows to George Street* and *West Edinburgh 'Mini-Holland.'* The final winner(s) will be known this summer and will receive significant funding for their 'ambitious' scheme(s). Meanwhile Edinburgh's West-East route is strongly expected to receive funding through the ordinary Community Links scheme.

LEITH STREET CLOSURE / OPPORTUNITY?

Leith Street is to close for 10 months from 4 September, to all but walk, cycle and emergency vehicles, for the St James work [[Evening News 1.3.17](http://www.eveningnews.co.uk)]. This would be a great opportunity for the Council to consider permanent closure. At the least one traffic lane could be removed at the top, to extend the Leith Walk segregated cycleways right up to Princes Street, instead of just to Calton Road as is currently proposed. *If you agree, speak to your councillors and your council election candidates!*

EDINBURGH BIKE STATION

Following last year's big fire, the [Bike Station](http://www.edinburgh.gov.uk) remains open in their temporary space in the warehouse at 246 Causewayside. The roof in the fire-damaged building is being repaired and they hope to re-open in April. Thanks to all the supporters who responded to the crowdfunder appeal last year which raised £16,230.

◆ Wanted: Stalls organisation help

◆ Wanted: policy expert

Our Planning Group manages to respond to virtually all *cycle scheme* consultations and relevant *planning applications*, but we sometimes don't have sufficient expertise and/or time to respond to *policy* consultations. For example - *Future of the Planning System in Scotland* [see *Consultations* article] could affect cycling significantly, for good or bad, but it looks like we won't make a submission. We need someone to do a draft for Planning Group comment before submission. There are several such policy consultations most years, so someone who could join Planning Group would be ideal (it meets every 4-5 weeks).
