#### **B3. EAST LOTHIAN SEGREGATED ACTIVE TRAVEL CORRIDOR [SATC]**

We'd be interested to hear briefly from anyone who attended the recent consultation on this. The following is an extract from the minutes of the June East Lothian Cycle Forum, about the proposals...

"The likelihood of a significant number of new housing/developments being built and planned in East Lothian in the next 10-20 years will bring significant pressure to the existing transport network. As part of the Council's strategy for mitigating this impact, within the LTS [Local Transport Strategy] there will be a requirement to consider sustainable travel options, to include improvements and better access to public transport, rail stations etc and walking and cycling infrastructure.

With that in mind discussions have taken place about utilising the former A1 trunk road, now the A199 which runs from Musselburgh via Haddington to Dunbar, as a main commuting cycle corridor route - linking with the various towns and villages and cycle routes nearby, to provide the opportunity for every day functional cycling as an alternative to private vehicle use. One of the former A1 trunk roads characteristics is the width, which could allow space to accommodate segregated cycle lanes, a key safety factor in considering cycling for short functional journeys and commuting.

The consultation findings will submitted by the end of October, to be considered for inclusion in the LTS."

#### **B4. DREM – GULLANE PATH CAMPAIGN**

This long and persistent campaign to provide an alternative to the dangerous main road to Drem station has continued with a well-attended community walk along the preferred route for a new path, supported by local MSP Iain Gray. #### D1. SPOKES MAPS ON SALE HERE - Linlithgow volunteer needed

#### D2. WEST LOTHIAN DRAFT ACTIVE TRAVEL PLAN – IMPORTANT - comments by 16 Dec

The Council's active travel officer, Deborah Paton, has now completed the draft *Active Travel Plan*, and is seeking comments before a final version is produced. **This is a really important document for the future of cycling (and walking) in West Lothian, and will guide investment in future years**. The document covers not just cycling infrastructure but how to link up all departments of the council, together with community and other groups, to create "a culture where active travel becomes the norm for suitable everyday trips."

It is very important for individuals to submit their own comments, and we would very much appreciate seeing a copy, to help with a spokes response.

#### D3. WLC LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN [LDP] - drop-ins Nov 2,5,9; comments by Nov 22

The Council is consulting on the above, Oct 12 - Nov 22. The plan sets out how West Lothian should develop in terms of housing, transport, etc in the coming years. It is a very important document – for example, when developers apply for planning permission they are less likely to succeed if their plans are not in line with the LDP.

The plan, an 'easy-read guide' and accompanying maps are at <a href="http://www.westlothian.gov.uk/proposedplan">http://www.westlothian.gov.uk/proposedplan</a>. The transport section of the plan is in paras 5.102 to 5.134, but other sections are also relevant – e.g. Town Centres, which comes after the transport section [the para numbers are muddled up, with two 5.133 and 5.134!].

As usual the plan talks of "priority ... to sustainable transport modes such as active travel, public transport and car share..." but it is not obvious that this will happen in practice. For example, the A89/A8 path is mentioned but there is no mention of cycling facilities in the sections on the A71 and A801.
