
## 1. Spokes central organisation - help is essential!!

Spokes is fortunate in having many members who take on individual one-off tasks, such as helping at mailouts or at stalls, or contacting their councillors or MSPs – and many other such one-off tasks. However there has to be a central core of volunteers who work together on a more regular ongoing basis to keep the organisation functioning effectively – indeed without this we'd not be able to create the above one-off opportunities!

- ◆ Office Manager(s) This is an really vital task, and could be shared between 2 people. Our current volunteer, Judy, who has looked after the office and related matters for several years, wants a change after the summer, so we need a replacement. We have already advertised this once, so please do consider whether you might be able to volunteer, or try it out.
  - o Initially you could work with Judy, to pick things up. Judy says, "This is a varied job, with the chance to meet a range of Spokes volunteers and contribute to our effectiveness. It helps to be an organised person and able to get on with a range of people."
  - The **time commitment** is a few hours per week on average, but could be less, especially if shared. Attendance at some of the evening Resources Group meetings held in the office or a member's house (every 3 weeks or so) is also helpful and provides ongoing support and a sounding-board. The job could be split between two volunteers, for example as below ...
  - o (a) **Dealing with letters received at Spokes Office** [someone else deals with email and phone] Processing new member and membership renewal forms, small map orders, miscellaneous enquiries. Recording and banking payments by cash and cheque and liaising with Treasurer, membership database team, Resources Group Co-ordinator etc
  - (b) Office Management Ensuring supplies for new member packs, stalls, Resources Group
    meetings, including replenishing Spokes maps from the map store. Frequent liaison with Resources
    Group Co-ordinator, Stalls organiser, St Martins Community Resource Centre (our Landlords).
  - If you might be interested please email spokes@ spokes.org.uk. This job is vital to Spokes!!
- ◆ Stalls assistant organiser Spokes ran 21 stalls during the first six months of the year, raising £726 and recruiting around 15 new members. We are really grateful to the many members who volunteer to help on stalls. However at present we only have one central stalls organiser, Mies, and she has new employment commitments coming. So we very much need an assistant stalls organiser to work with Mies − otherwise we will have to cut down on the number of stalls we run.
  - Stalls are an interesting opportunity to meet the public, and are very varied. Whilst many are at
    community festivals, others are at conferences or at environmental events such as the Science
    Festival Low Carbon travel event, giving great opportunities to meet and liaise with people and
    organisations with interests relevant to Spokes.

#### 6. Recent Edinburgh Transport Committee decisions

Mostly good, though the last one below isn't! Click the links in the headings below, and the other links, for info about each topic. - ◆ Edinburgh Transformation Major consultation is to start in September. The report is <a href="here">here</a> [7MB].
- ♦ Bus Lane times The Committee has agreed to consult on introducing 7-7-7 bus lanes, 7am-7pm, 7 days a week. This marks a complete reversal of the previous council's inexplicable decision to scrap Saturday bus lanes and cut back others to peak-time only despite our huge efforts at the time.
- ♦ Non-Residential Parking Levy
  There is pressure on the Scottish Government to allow Councils to levy
  premises on the basis of the number of car park spaces, over a certain minimum. In England the power
  applies only to employee car spaces (Workplace Parking Levy, WPL) but Spokes and others are strongly
  pushing for wider powers in Scotland so that, for example, there could be a levy on car spaces at out of
  town shopping centres to benefit town centres and local shopping. A report to Edinburgh's Transport
  Committee had proposed investigating a WPL, but thanks to a successful amendment by Spokes member
  Cllr Chas Booth a wider Non-Residential Parking Levy will be investigated.
- ♦ <u>West-East segregated route</u> The Committee approved the next stage of the Traffic and Redetermination Orders needed for the route, rejecting a LibDem amendment, supported by the Conservatives, which would have put the process on hold pending the outcome of various objections.
- ◆ Leith Street Big disappointment here, where we have still failed to get a cycleroute continued to the top of the road, rather than ending at Calton Road. However there remains hope, depending on how radical the City Centre Transformation (first bullet point above) turns out to be. A more temporary disappointment is that, although the Leith Street carriageway has been opened to all traffic, the cycleroute uphill to Calton Road has itself not been opened (pending the works in Picardy Place). The Council tells us they are looking for a temporary solution to allow this to open soon, albeit it will not have big usage until it is extended down to Leith Walk and through Picardy Place.

## 7. Locally-based bike action

Increasingly, people in local parts of Edinburgh and the Lothians are getting together to promote local discussion and lobbying. We are happy to email Spokes members in any specific area to let them know of any such local meeting, and to support local lobbying as best we can given that Spokes is all volunteer.

- ◆ West Edinburgh Thanks particularly to a couple of local individuals (both Spokes members) a great deal of local lobbying goes on, much of it centred round <a href="Harts Cyclery">Harts Cyclery</a> and <a href="Members">@Hank\_Chief</a>, though there have not been local meetings as such.
- ♦ South Edinburgh Local meeting and embryonic local group set up as <u>Safe Cycling South Edinburgh</u> covering largely the area south of Grange and out to the City Bypass. Inspired by this, Spokes member <u>Cllr Scott Arthur</u> raised the issue at the <u>Aug 9 Transport Committee</u>, where he was promised a meeting for South Edinburgh cycling activists with himself and relevant Council officers. - ◆ Portobello A 'Spokes Porty cell' may be set up. We will try to email local members if a meeting is held.
