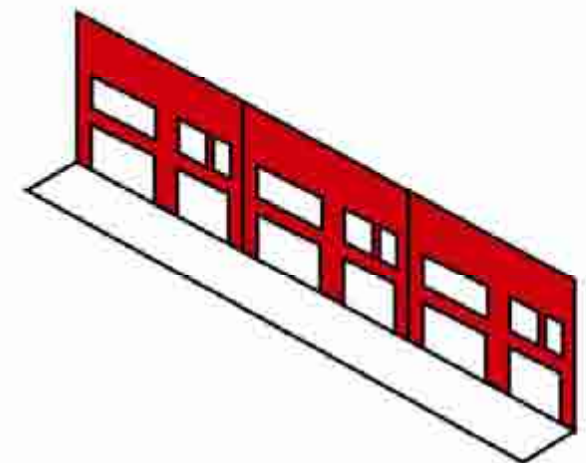
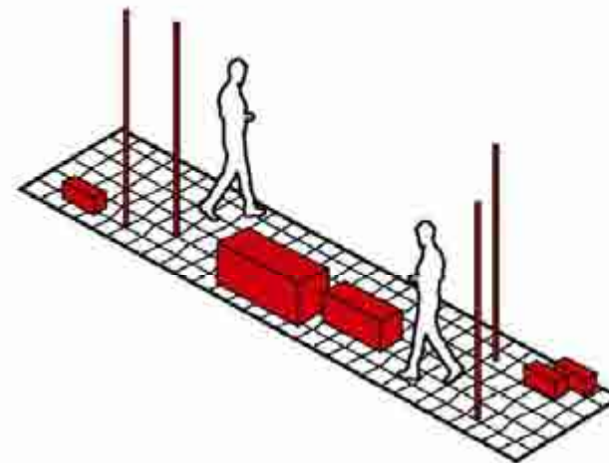
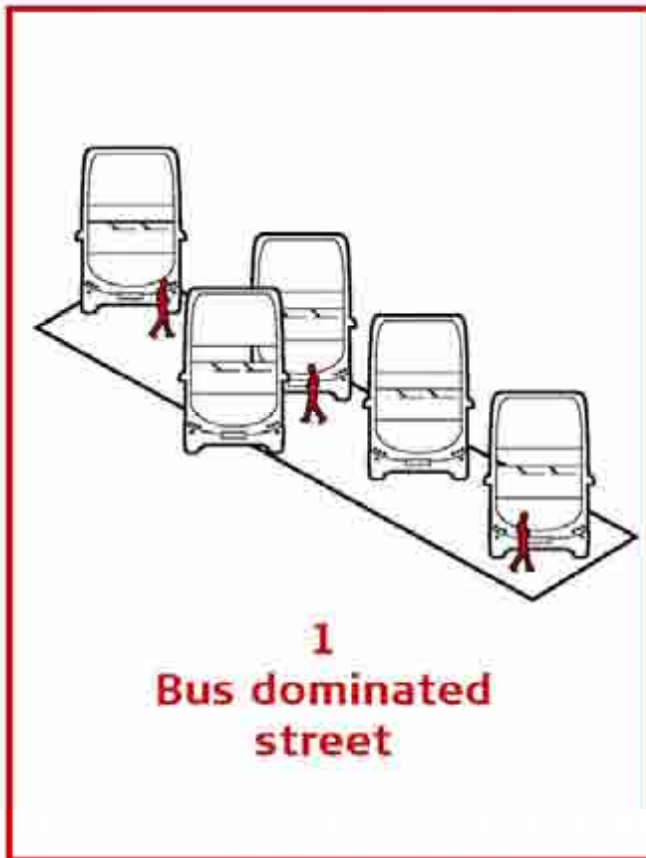
General problem in Edinburgh

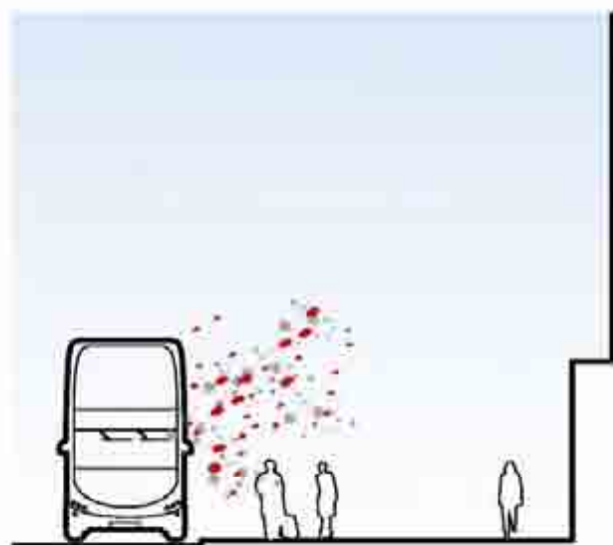

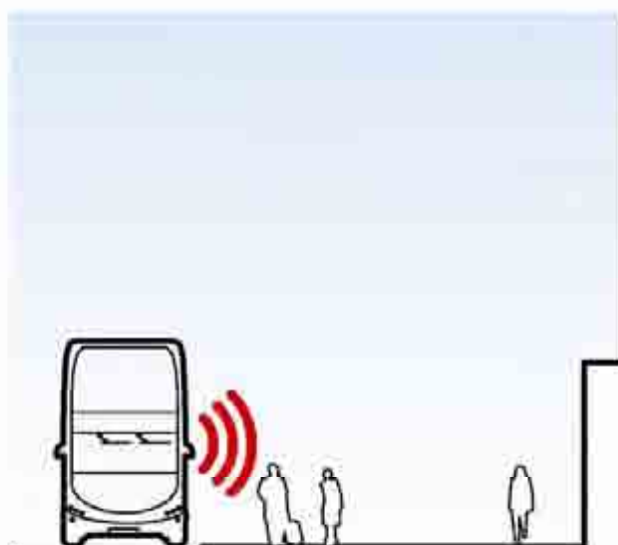

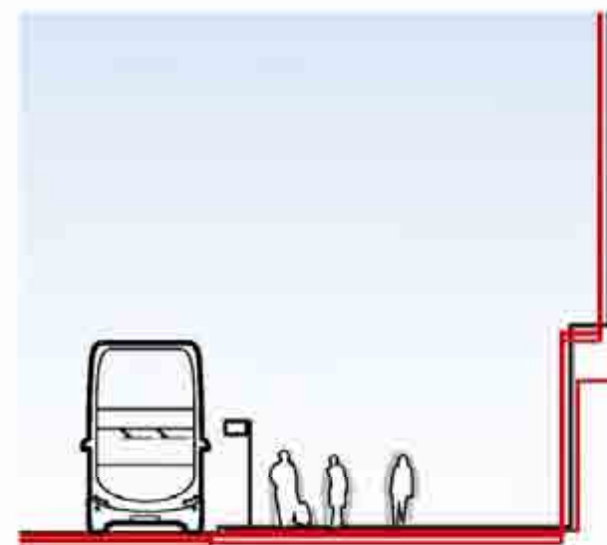

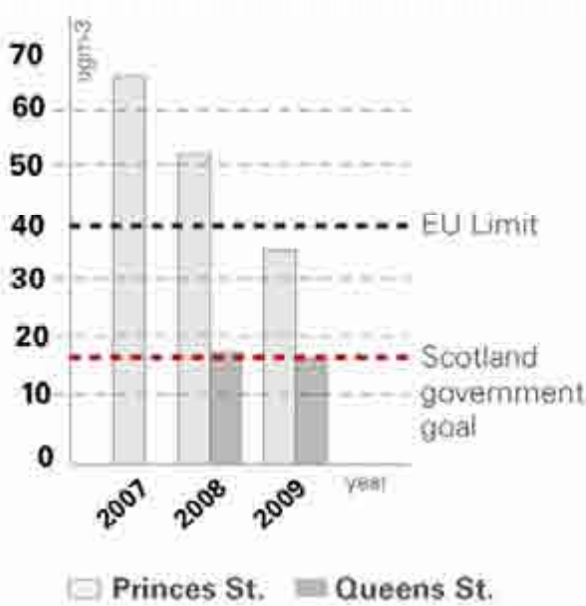
Fumes, noise and vibrations caused by busses effects the quality of Princes Street

Noise Levels

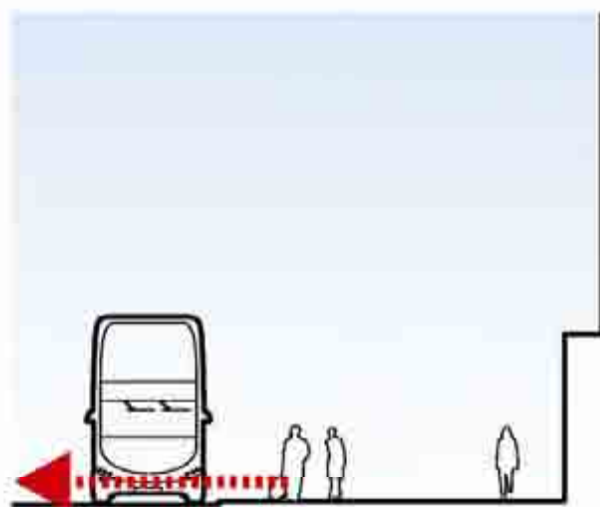


Fume Levels

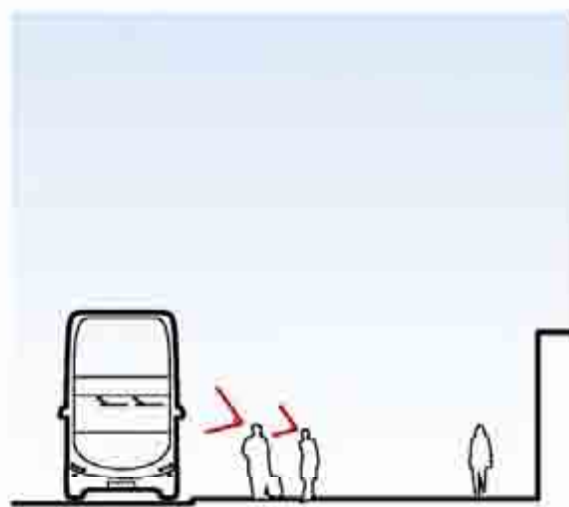
Most of the day noise levels are above 90db - The limit at a factory before earmuffs are required is 85db

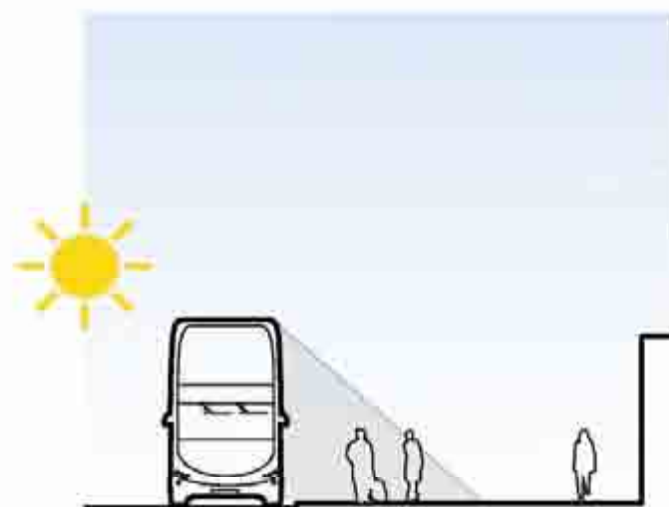

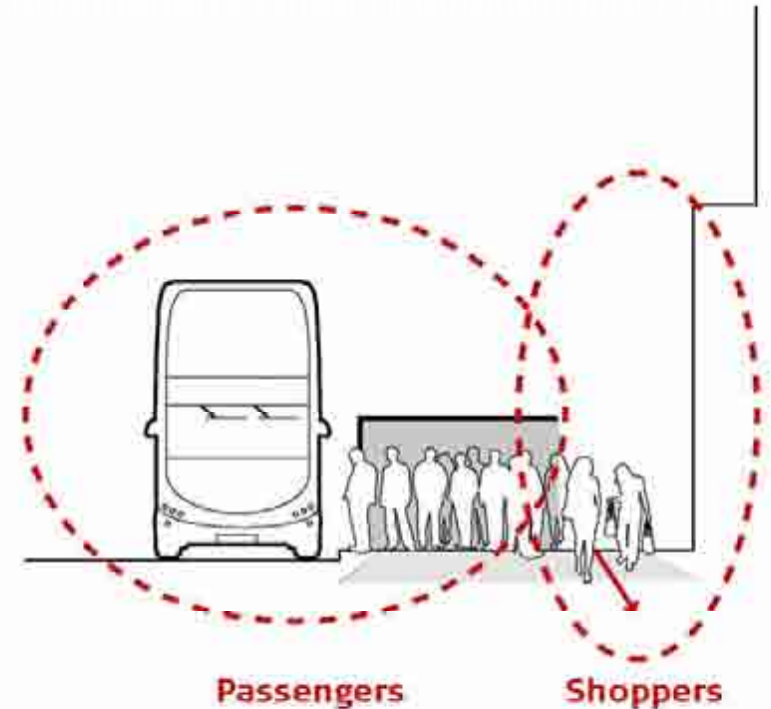

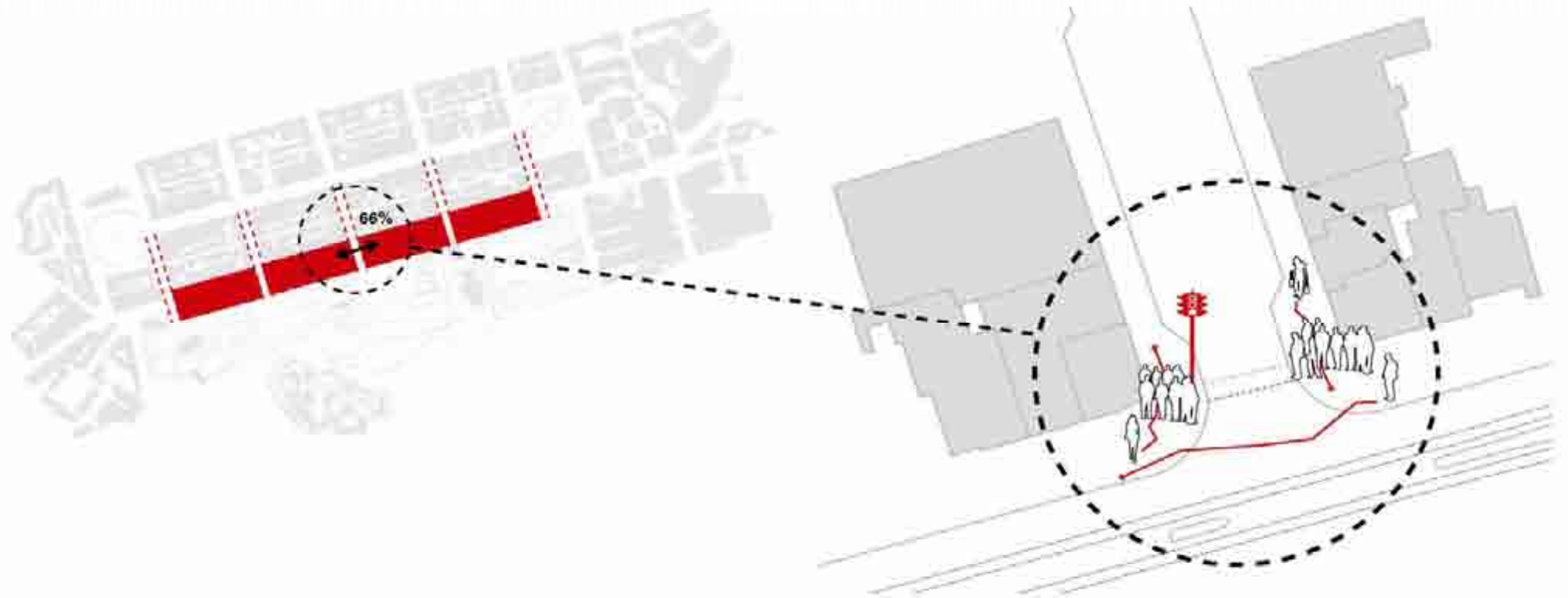

Pedestrians in Princes Street **Walking along the street**



66% of the people crossing Frederick Street cross at red man

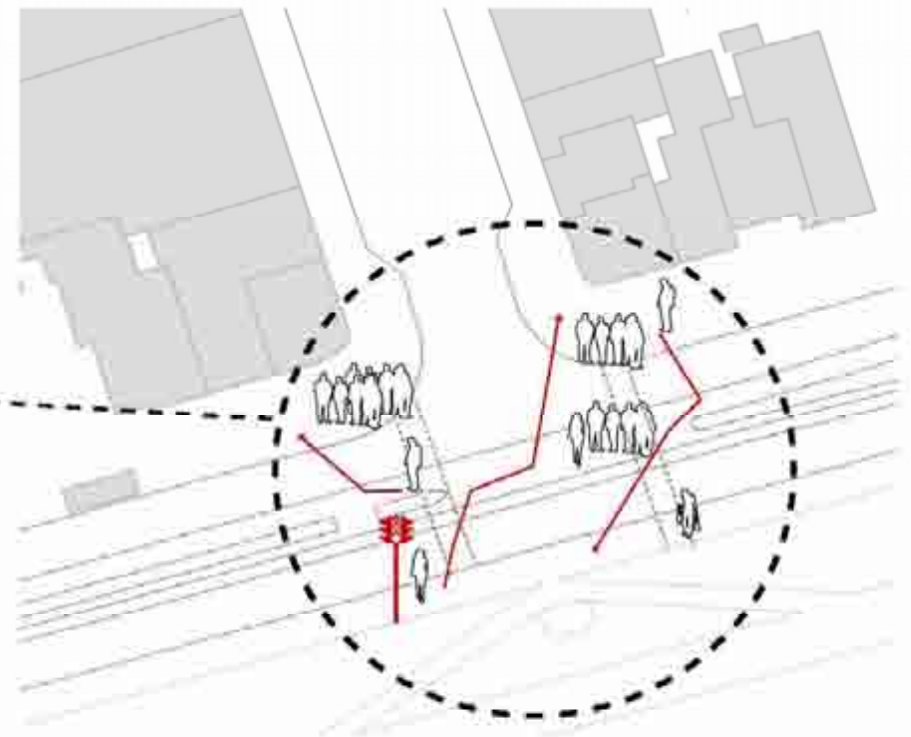
Push buttons waiting time causes clustering and jaywalking

Princes Street is divided into sections causing many crossings - lack of pedestrian priority!

65% of the people crossing Princes Street at Frederick Street cross at red man - no pedestrian priority!



People find their own way across

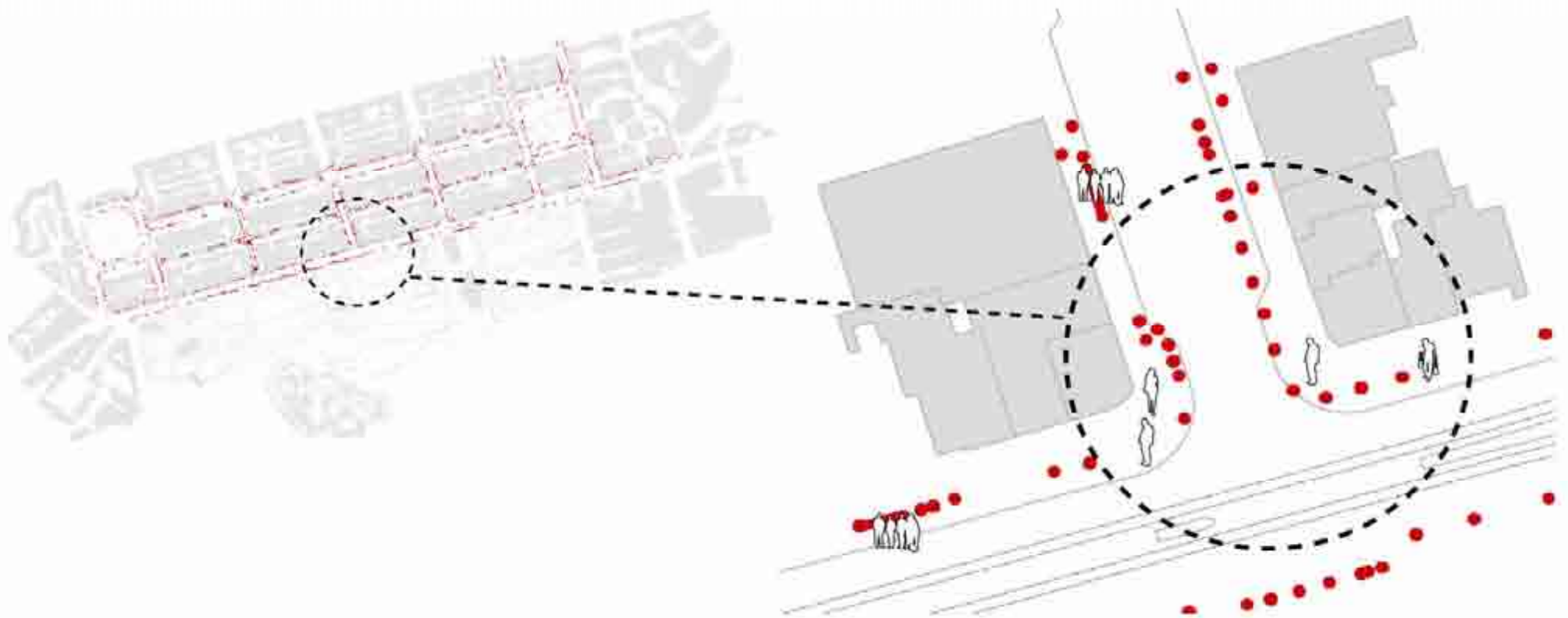
Lack of pedestrian priority causes a lot of jaywalking

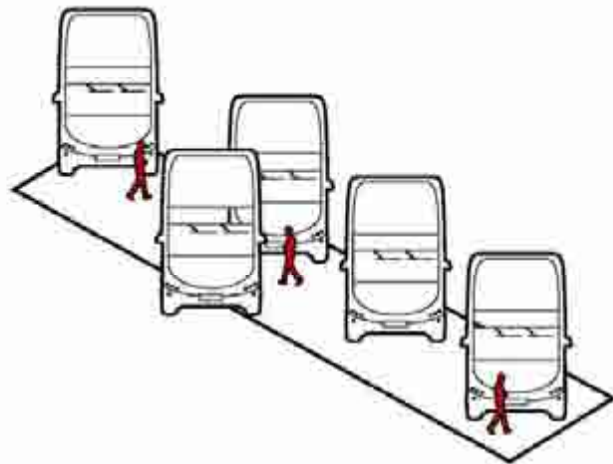

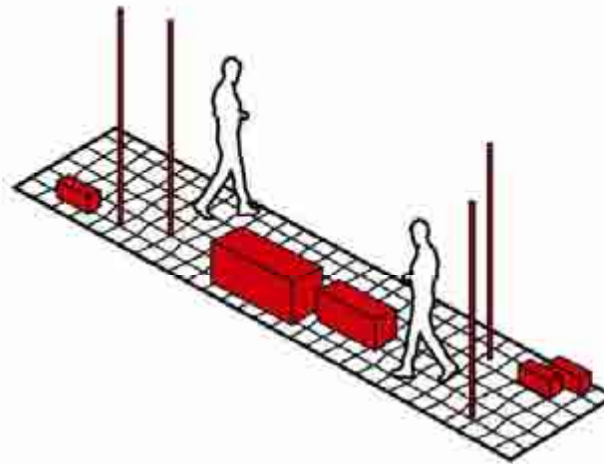

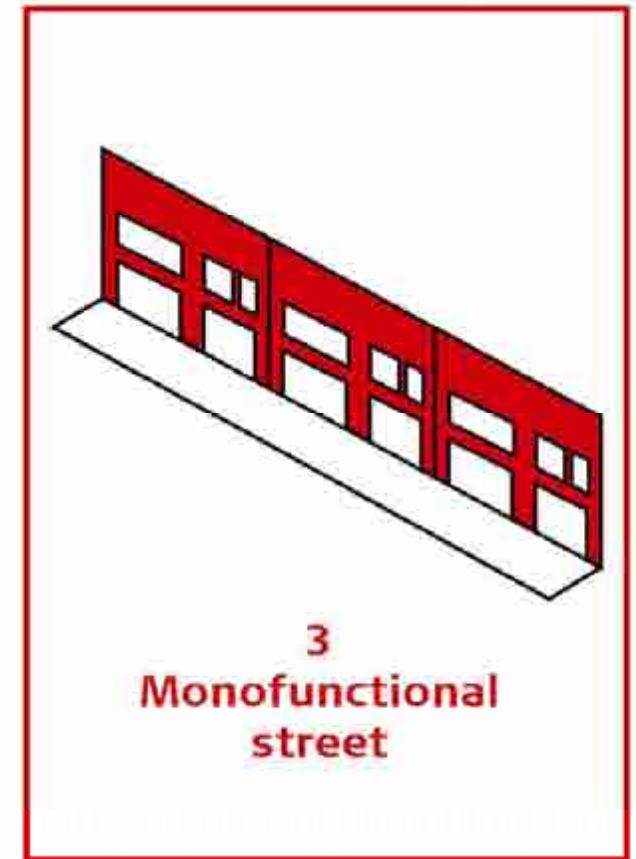

Princes Street does not represent the Scottish population!

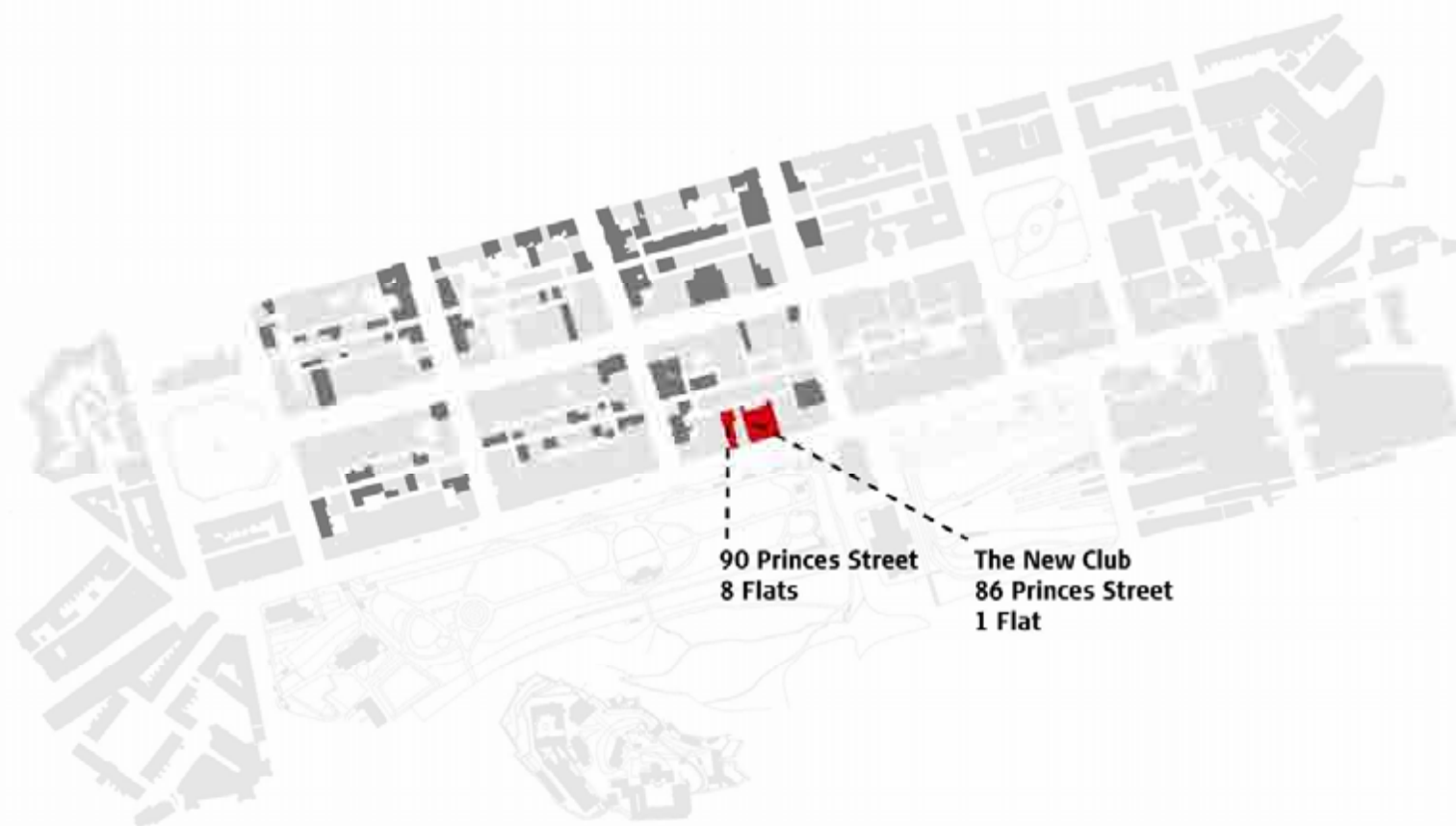

Transport - Only focus on busses and cars

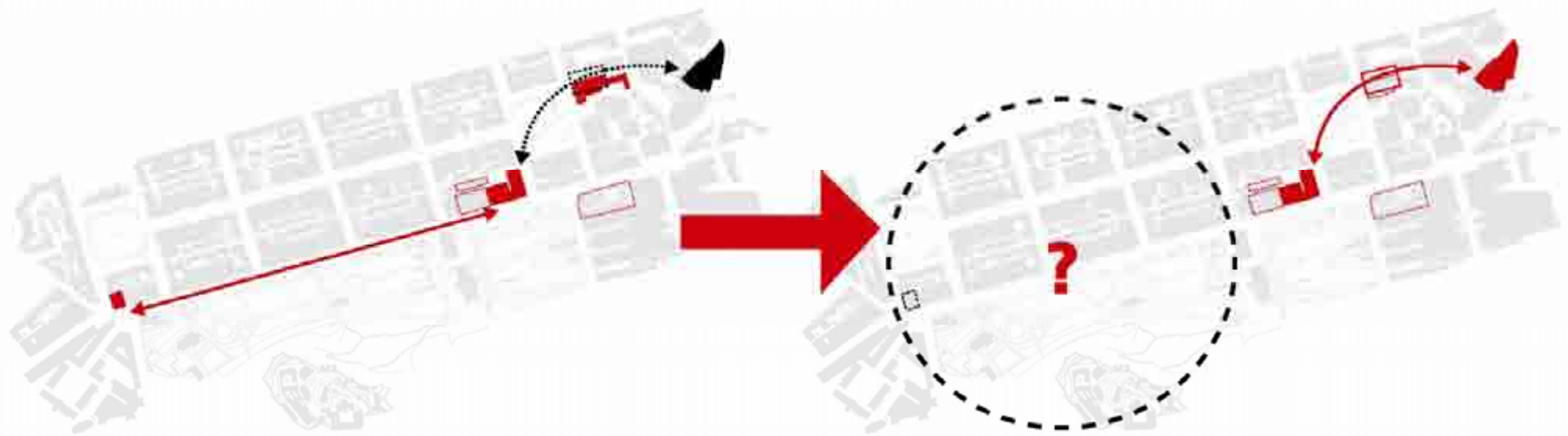


- Lack of focus on walking and cycling

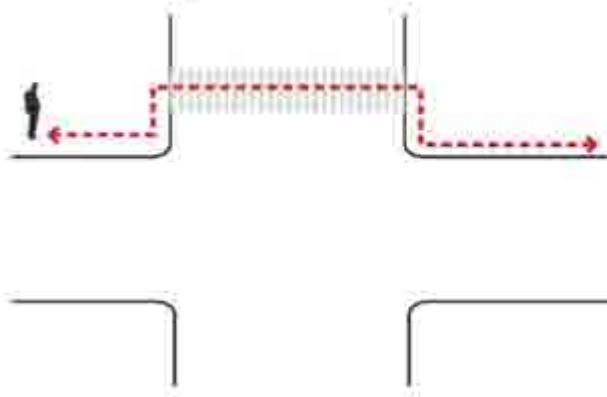

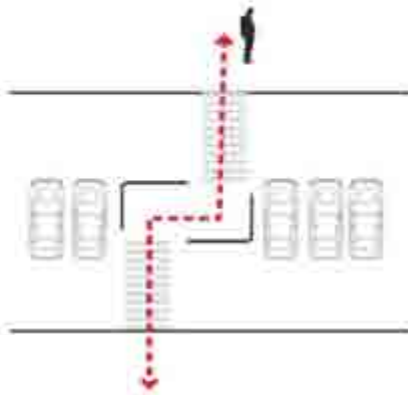
