The proposals are:

- Introduce waiting and loading restrictions on Riccarton Avenue to keep crossing points clear.
- Close the road at the junction of Curriehill Road and Forthview Crescent with the exception of blue badge holders, waste vehicles and for residents.
- Introduce waiting and loading restrictions on Forthview Crescent to keep crossing points clear.

Curriehill Rd is a busy partly-residential road connecting Lanark Rd W (A70) to Calder Rd (A71); Riccarton Ave runs east-west, is fairly busy, and can become a rat-run avoiding the A70 at busy times.

The restrictions apply on both sides of the side-road junctions, which is good.

The proposals thus seem sensible and reasonable.
