Spokes Porty welcomes the council's continued attempts to improve space for safety for active travel around Brunstane Primary and fully supports this proposal.

The use of full time 'School Streets' style filtering on Magdalene Drive seems appropriate in this case. We feel that a full 'School Streets' scheme, similar to those which have been successfully implemented around various other schools in Edinburgh, is the best solution to Bruntstane Primary's historic problem with traffic. We appreciate that this may not be possible under the Spaces For People scheme, but hope that such a solution is now being looked at in the longer term.

It would be good to work with the council's waste team to limit use of waste collection vehicles, where possible, in the vicinity of the school during drop off and pick up times.
