0. Finding your councillors

Find your councillors by typing your postcode on <u>this page</u>. If you already know your ward, <u>go here</u>. Note that everyone has either 3 or 4 councillors, usually from assorted parties.

1. Spokes Holyrood 2021 Election Hustings Thursday 15 April, 7.30

Spokes is holding an online election hustings for the Scottish Parliament election, Edinburgh and Lothians area, to discuss transport with particular reference to cycling. Please join in – just listen, or ask the candidates a testing question!!



We have speakers from the 5 main parties currently represented at Holyrood, all of whom are candidates for an Edinburgh/Lothians seat or for the Lothians List...

- ◆ Con <u>Damian Timson</u> [Almond Valley & Lothians List candidate, Conservative group leader on West Lothian Council]
- ◆ Green Chas Booth [Lothians List candidate, councillor, Spokes member]
- ◆ Lab Sarah Boyack [Lothians List candidate, previous MSP, Spokes member]
- ◆ LibDem Jill Reilly [Edinburgh Eastern & Lothians List candidate]
- ◆ SNP Ash Denham [Edinburgh Eastern & Lothians List candidate, previous MSP]
- ◆ QA chair Dr Caroline Brown of The Urban Institute, Heriot-Watt University

Each candidate will have up to 5 minutes to set out their party's position on transport, with particular reference to cycling. The meeting will then open for Q&A, for the remaining hour. At the end, the speakers will be asked to briefly sum up what they have learned from the meeting.

Due to the expected large attendance we will use the same GoToWebinar system as at our recent <u>#SpacesForPeople public meeting</u>, courtesy of Cycling UK Scotland, with the audience muted.

4. Spokes map buff - it's back!

5. Reporting things to the council

We have many times pestered the Council to set up a standardised method for reporting **abandoned bikes** on the public bike racks; and for easier ways to report **illegally parked vehicles**. Now they have responded, with clear instructions on what to do.

Both issues are now covered on the Council's Report It page. See the section called Roads, travel, parking.

The direct links are here...

- ◆ Abandoned bikes
- ◆ <u>Incorrectly parked vehicles</u> Note that the Council only has the powers to tackle certain types of illegal parking, whereas other types must be reported to the police. The page explains which is which, although it is still missing various situations such as zig-zag white lines.

Of course, reporting does not necessarily mean action, and we'd be interested to hear how you get on if you use these pages.

6. Spaces for People (SfP) - making successful schemes permanent

- ◆ We had a great public webinar, with over 150 people online for most of the meeting! There is a detailed report on our website, including a link to a full recording of the meeting
- Of course, there are many detailed issues with the temporary infrastructure, but each scheme that is made permanent would be fully assessed and redesigned with permanent materials, on the basis of experience and of a full Road Order consultation. Spokes made a major submission to the Council's recent general consultation on this, covering many of these issues see it here.
- ◆ Making permanent will require a lot of cash, so please raise this with your Holyrood election candidates (sections 1 and 2 above) the cash will need to come from the government (as did the SfP cash). Spokes and Living Streets have <u>written jointly</u> to the government about this.
- ◆ Locally, although many people welcome the SfP projects, there is also opposition. It is therefore important for councillors to know if it helps your journeys. If a particular scheme is helping you, please email your councillors (find them in section 0 at the top of this circular) and/or post a picture and/or comment on social media [e.g. 1 2 3 4 5] − tagging your councillors if possible. When posting pictures try always to include someone using the scheme, not just an empty street.
