1. Tribute to Sandy Scotland

We are very sad to hear of Sandy Scotland's recent death, following illness. Sandy joined Spokes in the 1980s and was pivotal in our work for several decades, up to the present, being central to many projects and campaigns to achieve better conditions for getting about by bike in Edinburgh and the Lothians. He was a long-standing active member of Spokes Planning Group, eventually becoming its coordinator until stepping down in 2020.

- Aug 28 Fairmilehead Cycling Event 3pm, short ride for all ages & abilities, then entertainment.
- Sept 3 Edinburgh Climate Festival 12noon 5pm, Leith Links. There will be a cargo-bike-based Spokes stall with maps and buffs at special stall prices. Also with our new cargo-bike-box (see below). Please come along and say hello. We would also welcome more stall helpers at this and other occasions, as we are having to turn down some stall opportunities due to too few available helpers.

4.2 Cargo-bike-box

We have been donated by <u>*Rhino Berlin*</u> this top of the range cargo-bike-box, which can attach to various cargo-bikes.

Thanks also to David Gardiner of *Laidback Bikes*, an Edinburgh cargo-bike specialist, for help with post-Brexit import paperwork hassles and delays.

Big thanks too to <u>CargoBikeMovement</u>, who are storing the box in their Tollcross premises and lending us a cargobike whenever needed for Spokes stalls.



4.3 Cargo-bike grants

Thanks to dedicated support from the Galashan Trust, Spokes will be able to offer grants up to £2000, rather than the present £1500, to *voluntary groups or micro-businesses* in Edinburgh or Lothians towards the purchase of a cargo bike. More details in next few weeks <u>on our website</u> and on social media.

Sadly we currently have no grants available to families or households; only organisations. However there is one £750 voucher prize for families or individuals towards a cargo bike in our summer competition – see (2) above.

4.4 Old edition Edinburgh Spokes maps, free to good homes

We still have around 200 copies of the previous (2016, with 2019 updates) edition. They are free to any community or educational organisation that can make use of them. Obviously they are not for resale, and we hope they will go to people who cannot easily afford one or would not buy one, or for educational purposes.

Already we have donated to Bikes for Refugees, to a community library, a college and a primary school.

We also have a *factsheet showing potential uses in schools*.

5.1 Inch Park Masterplan – ends 28 Sept

- The plan covers many aspects of this huge parkland between Gilmerton Road and Old Dalkeith Road, including paths and entrances. However Spokes would like to see much more attention to paths within and through the park and, equally important, links to it. We hope to put out our draft response on social media later this month, but here are some thoughts already sent to us by members and others. Please consider these points for your own response to the Council...
 - A toucan crossing is needed at the entrance leading from Old Dalkeith Road to Peffermill
 - The existing road humps on the approach to Inch House from Gilmerton Road are terrible on a bike
 - The new path along the south side of the Park would be an improvement on the above existing weaving and severely humped path, and would give a more direct road crossing than the current staggered one
 - Too little thought has been given to the design of paths in relation to pedestrian/cyclist issues, particularly those routes which are main accesses to facilities, or through routes
 - There is no reference to the Council's planned improved Cameron Toll to BioQuarter route
 - If more people cycle through the park, they will see the facilities and grow the patronage for the cafe

- East Lothian Council is consulting on the future of the High Street... www.eastlothian.gov.uk/news/article/13882/north berwick high street - community engagement
- There is also an online survey form (till 28 Aug)
- The stated aims are... to create a safer, more accessible, and more attractive High Street that meets the needs of all users and businesses

by providing quality infrastructure and placemaking. The final solution should provide benefits by prioritising walking, wheeling (wheelchairs, prams etc.) and cycling for everyday journeys and leisure trips, retaining access to the businesses on High Street, allowing for loading and servicing and creating a more pleasant environment.

 One issue not mentioned in the consultation document is allowing 2-way cycling in this 1-way street. There are several ways of doing this, even where space makes a

contraflow lane infeasible, and Edinburgh Council has described some options in this factsheet.

- Local group **Cycleforth** (contact mark.holling @ btinternet.com) will be responding to the consultation, possibly jointly with Spokes Planning Group
- However, please do make your own personal submission if you live in, work or visit the town (and say that you do). There appear to be strong views in different directions about how far the Council should go in reducing or limiting car access, so it is important that everyone supporting "a more pleasant environment" responds to the consultation.
